



Does Your Child Have Allergies?

Physicians at the NIH in the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases are conducting a research study to learn more about allergies.

This study will evaluate children with different allergies in order to learn more about their diseases and to gain information that may be useful in developing new treatments. Standard care for allergic diseases will be provided at no cost to the patient.

Who may participate:

- Children 6 months to 18 years of age.
- Children who have a diagnosis of asthma, allergic rhinitis, food, drug or bee venom allergy, urticaria (hives), or atopic dermatitis.

What is involved:

- Complete history and physical exam.
- Allergy skin testing.
- Pulmonary lung function test.
- No experimental therapy will be provided.
- A physician referral is required.

Length of time:

- After the initial visit, follow up visits will range from every month to every 3 to 6 months.
- No charge for study related tests or treatment.
